Notice of Race

Note: Items in red signify a deviation from the standard NOR wording

1 Organising Authority

- 1.1 This regatta is organised under the overall authority of the New Zealand Radio Yachting Association (NZRYA) and conducted by the North Shore Radio Yacht Squadron (the Organising Authority) and it's duly appointed Race Committee with assistance from the Kerikeri Radio Yacht Squadron and in conjunction with the NZLIOMNCA.

2 Rules

- 2.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing 2025-2028 as amended by Appendix E (Radio Sailing Racing Rules).
- 2.2 **The heat management system to be used will be advised at Saturdays briefing.**
- 2.3 The following documents will apply:
- (a) This Notice of Race (NOR)
 - (b) **The event's Sailing Instructions to be advised at the briefing.**
 - (c) The International One Metre Class Rules 2022
- 2.4 Yachting New Zealand Prescriptions (where relevant to radio sailing) shall apply.

3 Eligibility and Entry

- 3.1 Competitors shall be affiliated members, in good standing, of NZRYA, or members of the Member National Authority (MNA), or Designated National Member (DNM) of their country of residence.
- 3.2 Competitors who reside outside of New Zealand and intend to enter this event must have valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of NZ\$2 million per incident or the equivalent.
- 3.3 The following class will be sailed: International One Metre (IOM).
- 3.4 **Each boat shall have a current, valid IOM Class Certificate and Personal Number Certificate (if applicable) available on request.**
- 3.5 For the purpose of resolving sail number conflicts, preference shall be given to sail numbers as follows: 1) NZL personal sail numbers, 2) other country personal sail numbers, 3) non personal sail numbers in order of receipt.
- 3.6 Eligible skippers may enter using the online entry form: [Click here](#).

3.7 Entries close at 1700 on Sunday Mar 16 2025. Late entries may be accepted at the sole discretion of the Race Committee. A request for late entry must be received before 1700 on Wednesday Mar 19 2025.

4 Fees

4.1 The following fees apply:

- Entry Fee: NZ\$75.00 (includes dinner and drinks)
- Late Entry Surcharge: NZ\$20.00
- Extra partner dinner: NZ\$20.00

4.2 Payment should be made to the North Shore Radio Yacht Squadron account: 01-0274-0287600-00. Please reference your surname.

4.3 Payment will not be available at Registration.

5 Event Schedule

5.1 All times are local time as available on local mobile phone services.

5.2 **Schedule Notes:**

- Start and finish times are also at the discretion of the Race Officer.
- Saturday's racing will conclude with the traditional rum race.
- Following Saturday's rum race, we will adjourn to the ski club for the social drinks and dinner.
- The ski club will be open from 2pm on Friday for meet and greet.

5.3 All registration formalities, including payment and any measurement checks, must be completed in accordance with the schedule outlined in this Notice of Race.

5.4 There will be no formal boat measurement, however boats are required to be compliant and may be subject to random checks.

5.5 Briefings will be held lakeside.

5.6 There shall be no limit to the number of races/heats sailed on each day.

5.7 The timing and duration of any lunch breaks will be at the discretion of the RO and scheduled to best fit in with the racing. Lunch will not be provided. Competitors should self-cater for each day of the event.

5.8 A presentation will be held at the sailing venue as soon as practicable after the conclusion of racing on the last day of the event.

6 Heat Composition

6.1 Boats will be seeded in accordance with their ranking at national, regional or club level. Where ranking is not available, boats will be seeded first by alphabetical order of their national letters then by numerical order of their

sail number.

- 6.2 The heat composition will be displayed on heat boards at race headquarters.
- 6.3 The Race Committee may call heat starting fleets and check that competitors are in the start area prior to the warning signal. However, it is the responsibility of each competitor to be available for his/her heat.

7 Measurement

- 7.1 All boats must pass any measurement checks deemed necessary by the Organising Authority.
- 7.2 Boats may be subject to spot checks at any time.
- 7.3 All boats must comply with the International One Metre Class Rules 2022.

8 Radio Frequencies

- 8.1 For frequency bands other than 2.4Ghz, each competitor shall nominate a minimum of three (3) frequencies with their entry. Permitted frequency bands are 27, 29, 36, 40 Mhz and 2.4Ghz.

9 Sailing Instructions

- 9.1 The Sailing Instructions will be given at the briefing.

10 Venue

- 10.1 The event will be sailed at Kai Iwi Lakes, 555 Kai Iwi Lakes Road, Dargaville.

- 10.3 Launch and retrieval is dry.
- 10.4 **Venue Notes:**
- **There are no cafes or shops nearby - you will need to self-cater for all meals other than the Saturday night.**
 - **The entry fee includes the Saturday evening dinner and drinks at the ski club. Partners are very welcome at an additional cost of \$20.**
 - **Accommodation is in high demand - book as soon as you can.**

11 Prizes

- 11.1 The following prizes will be awarded:

12 Conduct

- 12.1 The New Zealand Radio Yachting Association, the NZLIOMNCA and the North Shore Radio Yacht Squadron recognize that all events offer considerable publicity opportunities to Clubs, Class Associations and the sport generally. Competitor behavior can impact unfavorably on the sport and all competitors.
- 12.2 Behavior by a competitor that is in breach of good manners or Sportsmanship and Fair Play (see Sailing Instructions Appendix A) or which may bring the sport into disrepute shall result in a hearing in accordance with RRS 2 or RRS 69.1.

13 Digital Property Rights

- 13.1 By taking part in this event, the competitor gives the organisation and the event's sponsors the right to use and show at any time, static or moving pictures, films and TV recordings of the competitor and/or their boat made

during this regatta in any materials, on any Web pages, and on any social media in support or in connection with the event, including the publication of results.

14 Personal Information

14.1 Personal information collected for the purpose of running this event will be handled in accordance with the NZRYA Data Privacy Policy. The policy can be found on the NZRYA website.

15 Risk Statement

15.1 By taking part in this event, the competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- (a) They will "Check, Clean and Dry" their boat and any equipment that may have pest organisms on it before sailing in this event.
- (b) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- (c) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- (d) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats, race officials and volunteers by the organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- (e) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.

16 Acceptance of Conditions

16.1 A competitor may only enter the event by acknowledging on the Entry Form that they accept the conditions of this Notice of Race.
